Care Home Proposal Latest

The proposal to build a new care home and car park just off Tarporley High Street is still being prepared for an official planning application

Liberty Properties - the company that wants to build a 65-bed 'Nursing Care Facility' and public car park in the centre of Tarporley - is hoping to submit a full planning application within the next few months. Following last year's public consultation, a Cheshire West and Chester Heritage Officer has also offered feedback on the scheme, which would see land to the south of St Helen's Parish Church being developed.

Following a stipulation in the Tarporley Neighbourhood Plan about the need for car parking, the proposal includes a large public car park - with 85 spaces - in addition to a 23-space separate car park for the care home. Liberty Properties predict the 'Class C2 Nursing Care Facility', which would also offer dementia care, would provide 64 jobs.

Christmas Event

Following the massive turnout at last year's Christmas Lights Event on the High Street, the Parish Council has received lots of helpful feedback from some of those who attended. Arrangements for this year are still under review, but the event will take place on Saturday 30th November, in the same central location. The attractions will be a little more spread out, Santa's Grotto will remain and the reindeer will move to the wooded area by St Helen's Church. The Parish Council also wants to co-ordinate more with various contributors and High Street businesses.

Recreation Ground

There should be some exciting progress on the Brook Road Outdoor Sports and Recreation Facility within the next few months. A Parish Council working group is currently focused on agreeing a drainage scheme with United Utilities. Once this is done, work can begin, starting with adding drainage and levelling the site.

A Project Manager will then be recruited to manage the works, funded by the ring-fenced S106 money, paid by Taylor Wimpey as part of the Brook Road housing development.

- Landscaping / planting on the Rode Street roundabout and other village entry points
- Replacement of the children's playground





Housing Needs...

There's been a good response to Cheshire West and Chester's Housing Needs Survey and a meeting was held on February 20th to review the results. Those attending included representatives from CWaC, the Parish Council, Weaver Vale Housing Trust (who run the Oathills Lea retirement complex) and our Ward Councillor, Eveleigh Moore Dutton.

The Parish Council is now waiting for Weaver Vale's thoughts on the future of Oathills Lea, but it is believed that the strength of village feeling that has been demonstrated towards the facility has made a big impact.

Neighbourhood Plan

The Tarporley Neighbourhood Plan will be three years old in March and the Cheshire West and Chester Local Plan is close to being finalised. The Parish Council believes that Tarporley's Neighbourhood Plan has been very important in influencing proposals put forward by developers (such as for the Care Home and Car Park) and directly led to saving the Bowling Green, Allotments and former Royal British Legion Car Park.


The Parish Council are considering starting a review of the Neighbourhood Plan to reflect 'changing circumstances and the current reality', which may include allocating further sites for car parking.

More Parking Spaces Needed...

Between 50 and 100 more car parking spaces are needed in the village, according to a document published by CWaC Council in January. Tarporley Parish Council - whose own survey determined an even greater need - is working alongside Ward Councillor Eveleigh Moore Dutton and CWaC Council to find a way to create more spaces in Tarporley.


